### 1 – Proposed Solution for Arsenic and Fluoride MCL Violation

Juniper Riviera CWD is currently receiving Technical Assistance from the State Water Board Division of Financial Assistance (DFA) to evaluate system improvements to address the Arsenic and Fluoride MCL violations. An engineering report has been developed by NV5 which proposes system improvements to increase system efficiency in terms of water quality, production, storage, and system monitoring. The proposed alternative includes construction of a new well (well no. 4), improving wells 1 and 2, and adding new storage tanks as well as rehabilitating several existing storage tanks within the system. An additional water source in combination with well improvements will give the district the ability to meet the MCLs for fluoride and arsenic as well as water demands within its service area while maintaining long term sustainability and reliability.

### Hello JRCWD Team,

This letter serves as a reminder of the Juniper Riviera County Water District's Grant Project Details and updates from the April 2025 teleconference between JRCWD and State Agencies.

**Project Background** – Juniper Riviera County Water District has three wells that supply the system. Well No. 2 has been issued citations and compliance orders for exceeding the maximum contaminant level (MCL). Well No. 3 is currently utilized on a limited basis due to the water quality exceedances of MCLs for fluoride and arsenic. The District has also received citations for exceeding the total Coliform MCL.

**Scope Definition** – The scope of The Office of Water Programs (OWP) Technical Assistance project is to complete the following work for Juniper Riviera County Water District to address system deficiencies in water quality, supply, and storage infrastructure deficiencies:

- · Construction Application (General, Technical, Environmental and Financial Packages)
- TMF Assessment
- · Engineering Report

Some potential alternatives to be examined in the engineering report include but are not limited to:

- § DRILLING OF A NEW WELL
- § PROVIDING WELLHEAD TREATMENT
- § CONSOLIDATION

Path Forward – James Owens, a P.E. at NV5 will move forward with design and spec development in addition to the environmental portions of the project. A request was made to include funding for a backup generator/s in this technical assistance project listed in the Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) with estimated costs.

Jason Heltzel, a Research Engineer at Sacramento State provided relevant information to the project team. The latest version of the PER developed by NV5 includes a mainline extension to loop a southern portion of Juniper Riviera's system. NOTE: If easements are not given to JRCWD by those property owners, this portion of the grant may be removed). It is worth noting that the DRAFT Biological Report is also completed. The work plan amendment continues in its process for approval for an extension of both time and an increase in NV5 costs as the project anticipated deadline dates have passed with continued work efforts to keep the project

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active. NV5 is requesting an additional \$40,000 with the extension and allocating contingency funding to complete the work plan tasks.

James Owens with NV5 mentioned at the March call that there may be additional regulations regarding setback requirements for Joshua Trees, which may affect the project's current design/layout. These Regulations are still in development at the County level with hopes of having more information later this summer.
